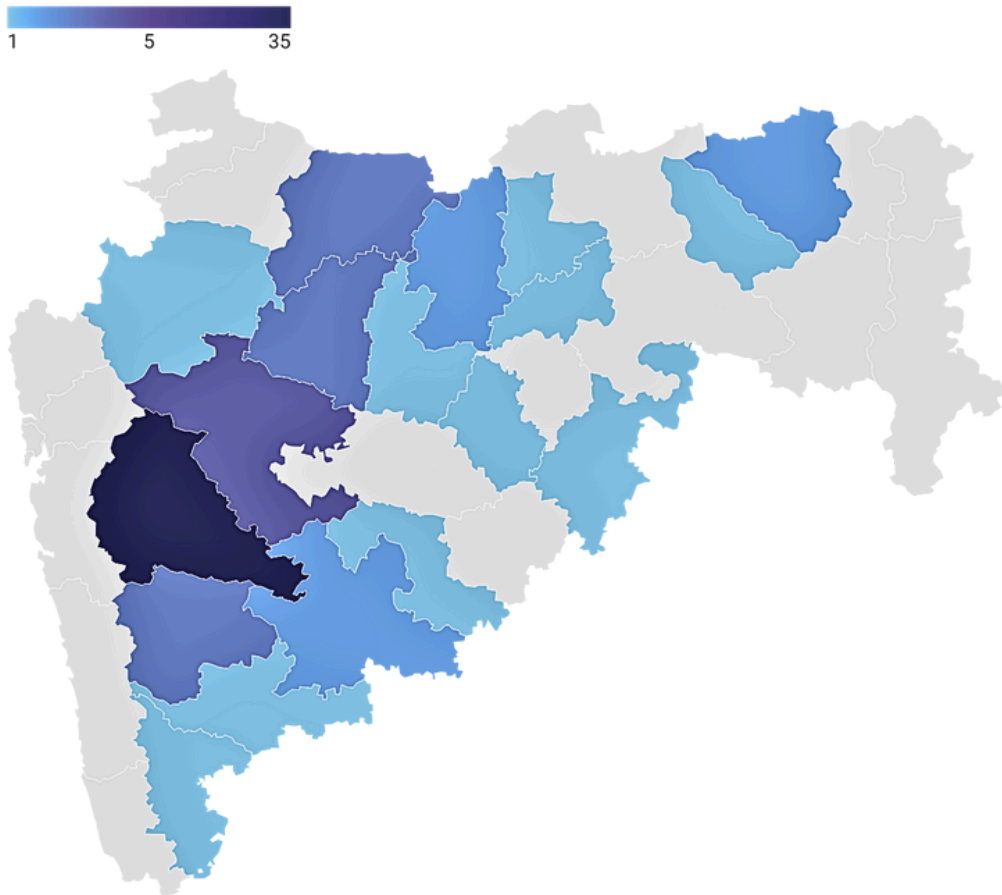

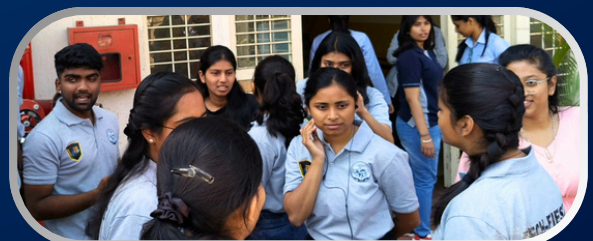
Blind Coding

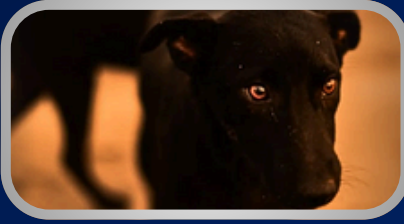

Kurdai Bhaji

Looking for something comforting, rustic, and full of Maharashtrian flavor? Try this soft and spicy Ittha Kurdai Bhaji – a simple dish that turns everyday ingredients into pure joy!

Ingredients :

- 3-4 pieces Ittha Kurdai (whole wheat)
- 1 onion, 3-4 green chillies, chopped
- Mustard seeds, curry leaves, hing
- Roasted peanut powder
- Oil, turmeric, salt, sugar
- Fresh coriander



Let's Cook:

- Soak kurdai till soft, then break into pieces.
- Heat oil → add mustard, curry leaves, hing, chillies & onion. Sauté till golden.
- Add turmeric + soaked kurdai, mix it all up.
- Toss in peanut powder, a pinch of sugar, salt (go easy – kurdai has salt).
- Garnish with fresh coriander.

Kalki 2898 AD : 6.5/10

It's a bold mix of sci-fi and Indian mythology, stunning visuals and a grand cinematic scale. Amitabh Bachchan shines, and the world-building is impressive. However, the first half feels slow, and some characters lack depth. Despite its flaws, it's a refreshing.



Chhava : 7/10

Vicky Kaushal shines in this visually grand historical drama, backed by strong performances and rich sets. Though let down by weak writing and loud execution, it still feels proud to see such a powerful chapter of history brought to screen.

Final Destination: Bloodlines - 5/10

Despite a few creative death scenes and nostalgic callbacks, Bloodlines struggles with predictable plotlines, shallow characters, and weak emotional payoff. It tries to revive the franchise but lacks the impact of earlier entries. Entertaining in parts, but mostly forgettable.



Saiyaara : 6.5/10

Saiyyara tells its story with sincerity. Unfortunately, people turned it into reel rather than real—loud opinions and overhype diluted its emotional depth. This noise has pushed many away from truly experiencing its quieter, genuine moments. Let the film speak, not the crowd.
